## Activities Allowed in Modified Phase 1 Updated October 8, 2020

As of August 26, 2020, Chelan, Douglas, Benton, Franklin and Yakima counties are in a modified phase 1 per the <u>Safe Start plan</u>. In addition to all phase 1 activities, the following activities are allowed in a modified phase 1 status starting on August 27, 2020.

Activity Type	Activities Allowed
Social gatherings	<ul> <li>Social gatherings are only allowed outdoors with 5 or fewer people outside the household per week. Physical distancing of at least 6 feet must be maintained.</li> </ul>
Indoor fitness and training	• As outlined in <u>Phase 2 guidance</u> .
Additional construction	• As outlined in <u>Phase 2 guidance</u> .
Manufacturing operations	• As outlined in <u>Phase 2 guidance</u> .
Real estate	<ul> <li>As outlined in <u>Phase 2 guidance</u> but guest occupancy limited to 25% of building occupancy and indoor services limited to 30 minutes per customer.</li> </ul>
In-store retail (essential and non-essential)	<ul> <li>As outlined in <u>Phase 2 guidance</u>. (Guest occupancy is limited to 30% of maximum building occupancy or lower as determined by the fire code.)</li> </ul>
Personal services	• As outlined in <u>Phase 2 guidance</u> , but occupancy limited to 25% of building occupancy, with the exception of one to one service in an enclosed room.
Professional services	• As outlined in <u>Phase 2 guidance</u> , but occupancy limited to 25% of building occupancy, with the exception of one to one service in an enclosed room, and indoor services limited to 30 minutes per customers.
Weddings, funerals and memorials	• Up to 30 people or 20% capacity, whichever is less; receptions not permitted.
Professional photography	• As outlined in <u>Phase 2 guidance</u> .
Domestic services	• As outlined in <u>Phase 2 guidance</u> .
Pet grooming	<ul> <li>As outlined in <u>Phase 2 guidance</u>, but occupancy limited to 25% of building occupancy.</li> </ul>
Restaurants, taverns, breweries, wineries and distilleries	<ul> <li>As outlined in <u>Phase 2 guidance</u> but guest occupancy indoors is limited to 25% of maximum building occupancy as determined by the fire code. Outdoor seating is permitted at 50% capacity.</li> </ul>
<i>Staffed water recreation facilities</i>	<ul> <li>As outlined in modified Phase 1 guidance.</li> <li>Authorized operations include appointment-only lap swimming, one-on-one lessons, and small group classes (groups of 5 or less) at general use swimming pools only (e.g., athletic club pools and municipal pools) as defined in WAC 246-260-010(34) and WAC 246-260-010(74). General use spas, general use wading pools, general use spray pools, limited use pools as defined in WAC 246-260, and any recreational water contact facility regulated under WAC 246-262 are not included in this authorization at this time.</li> </ul>
Religious services	• As outlined in <u>Phase 2 religious guidance</u> but indoor services at a place of worship limited to 25% of room capacity or up to <u>50 people, whichever is less</u> , so long as six feet of physical distancing can be achieved between households.
Library services	• Curbside services only as outlined in <u>Phase 2 guidance</u> .
Drive-in events, including movies and airshows	• As outlined in <u>Phase 2 guidance</u> for drive in theatres.
Outdoor card rooms	<ul> <li>As outlined in <u>Phase 2 guidance</u> but the outdoor card room designated area of each facility is limited to <u>50 individuals</u>, (excluding organization staff), if proper physical distancing can be achieved.</li> </ul>
Agritourism Activities	As outlined in Phase 2 guidance.
