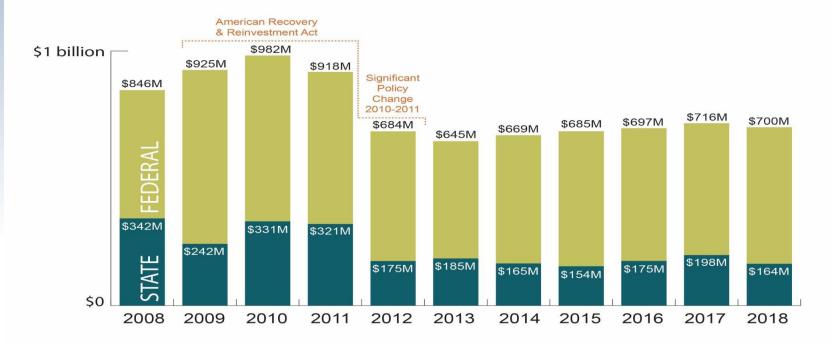


#### **History of Funding for TANF**

#### 2019 Legislative Session

#### **Major Changes Impacting TANF/WorkFirst**

- **2SHB 1603** Removes permanent disqualification and adds homelessness as a criteria for time limit extension.
- 2SHB 1893 Provides assistance to help to help students remain enrolled in post-secondary education.

#### ESA Budget

- Funding for 1603 implementation
- > Pregnant Women Assistance Grant Increase
- Decreased funding for Workfirst services, but transportation pilots and Working Family Support continue





#### 2019 Legislative Session

#### **Major Changes Impacting TANF**



#### **Budget:**

- Commerce Homeless services funding increase
- Heath Care Authority Legislation and funding increases to address mental health and substance use disorders
- Department of Children Youth and Families
   — Child care subsidy transition, funding increases for home visiting and early childhood services

#### Working Family Support (WFS) Possible Increase

#### **Currently \$10 per working family per month, net \$7 after Basic Food decrease**

Increase WFS Grant to:	Additional Annual Cost	Reduces Basic Food by:
\$15.00	\$174,840	\$4.50





#### TANF time limit extension disproportionality action plan

- 1) Quick case reviews completed April 2019
- 2) Implement supervisory review of denials June 2019
- 3) Review policy using an EDI tool June-July 2019
- 4) In depth study by DSHS Research and Data Analysis (RDA)
- 5) Transforming Case Management initiative
- 6) Considering additional changes to practices regarding time limit extension and proposals for change to the policy

#### Structural fixes for system we need

(e.g., eligibility based on decent standard of living; reduce income inequality; shift from punitive policy to person/family-support policy)

#### Making the most of the system we have

(e.g., no "secret handshake"; allowing individuals and families to "take a breath": "continuum of care")

#### **Foundation**

Call-to-Action, Strategies, Shared Outcomes, Accountability, Leadership (e.g., Legacy Council, new need standard, ongoing equity training for leadership and staff)

# Strategic Plan -- How we get to Recommendations

- We name the outcome we are seeking: Washington residents, especially indigenous Washingtonians, people of color, are free from poverty and have the resources needed to reach their full potential.
- We gather data qualitative and quantitative
- We analyze data to identify what is working and what is not.
- Based on what we have learned, we develop recommendations





# Strategic Plan Development THEN WHAT?

- Recommendations are refined.
- Recommendations go to the Steering Committee for their review and affirmation.
- Recommendations from Steering Committee come to the Working Group for discussion and consideration



# Poverty Reduction Workgroup Themes Lives

#### Mental Health

- Children's mental health
- Care need for children when parents are struggling
- Benefits "cliff"
  - Off ramp and transportation supports
- Agency Coordination
  - Case worker consistency, interactions and communications
  - Support family stability with continuum of care.



# Strategic Plan – Recommendations are big and small

- As the PRWG makes its plan items with an Intergenerational lens will be identified for consideration by this Task Force
- Some recommendations may be early wins that can build to larger and longer term strategies
- Some recommendations may be bigger ideas that will take time to bring to fruition
