TECHNICAL NOTES

Eligible Population. Individuals who either received Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) at some point during SFY 2016 or whose Assistance Unit (AU) had an effective closure date in some month during SFY 2016 and:

- 1. Had their TANF assistance unit (AU) closed during SFY 2016 because their AU reached the benefit's 60-month time limit OR the AU was close for some other reason and, upon re-applying for the benefit, the AU was denied an TANF benefit extension; OR
- 2. Had their TANF assistance unit (AU) closed during SFY 2016 for any other reason; OR
- 3. Received the TANF benefit in any month during SFY 2016 and did not have their AU closed because they reached the benefit's 60-month time limit OR because the AU was close for some other reason and, upon reapplying for the benefit, the AU was denied an TANF benefit extension.

All Assistance Unit Members. All actives clients associated with a TANF AU and identified as recipients of the benefit.

Head of Household. Clients identified as the primary beneficiary/head of household of an assistance unit for the TANF benefit.

Children and Dependent Youth. All active clients associated with a TANF AU who were identified as recipients of the benefit and who were identified as the head of household's: 1) natural or adopted child; 2) co-parent's child; 3) stepchild; 4) former step- or natural child; 5) child who is also a minor parent; 6) grandchild; 7) dependent first cousin; or 8) great or dependent niece/nephew, or dependent sibling (child). Also included in this category are children who are under the legal guardianship of, or other children being cared for by, the head of household of an AU.

NOTE: An asterisk ("*") indicates that the contents of a cell have been suppressed because the total client count in that cell was less than or equal to 10.

MEASUREMENT INFORMATION

- 1. Age was calculated as of the month after a client last received the TANF benefit.
- Information on client demographics, emergency department usage, inpatient/outpatient services, hospitalization records, Medicaid eligibility, homelessness, prior employment, and conviction and arrest records come from the Integrated Client Database.
- Medicaid assistance includes all clients receiving any form of Medicaid or other medical assistance.
- 4. Mental health service need is indicated for any individual who in the 24 months prior to case closure: 1) was diagnosed with a psychotic, mania/bipolar, depressive, anxiety, attention deficit and/or hyperactive, disruptive/impulse control/conduct, or adjustment disorder; 2) had an antipsychotic, antimania, antidepressant, antianxiety, or ADHD prescription filled; 3) received mental health services, or 4) received behavioral health rehabilitation services from the Children's Administration.
- 5. The population for the substance use disorder indicator, diagnosis, and treatment and arrest and convictions metrics was restricted to individuals age 12 or older.
- 6. Housing instability/homelessness status was identified using shelter information in the Department of Commerce's Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) or living arrangement status information recorded in the Economic Services Administration's (ESA) Automated Client Eligibility System (ACES). A client was identified as unstably housed in the measurement period if: 1) they ever appeared in the HMIS system; or 2) if there was an indication that they were homeless without housing, homeless with housing, currently residing in a battered spouse's shelter or emergency shelter, housed but paid less than \$25 in rent, or living in an inappropriate living situation as of the most recent system post date for that month. Homelessness following exit was calculated as of the first month that a client did not receive TANF or July of the next fiscal year.
