



PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR

25-02

Atmospheric River Storm Damage

WHEREAS, from February 20 through March 3, 2025, a powerful atmospheric river brought severe weather, including straight-line winds, heavy rainfall, and above-average temperatures leading to snow and ice melt, flooding, downed trees, landslides, and rockslides, all causing widespread damage; and

WHEREAS, the counties of Chelan, Douglas, Franklin, Garfield, Klickitat, Lincoln, Pacific, Pierce, Spokane, Wahkiakum, and Whitman experienced severe impacts that threatened public health, safety, and economic stability; and

WHEREAS, these storms caused extensive disruptions in roadways and transportation networks, creating hazardous conditions and endangering public safety, requiring the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) to coordinate resources for debris removal and infrastructure repair; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost of response activities and roadway repairs as of the date of this Proclamation are estimated at \$6,800,000; and

WHEREAS, the damage and effects of the storms impact people's lives and health as well as property and transportation infrastructure, all of which constitutes a public disaster that affects life, health, property, or public peace in Washington state; and

WHEREAS, the Washington State Military Department has been monitoring and coordinating supporting actions through the State Emergency Operations Center, implementing emergency response and recovery procedures, and coordinating resources to support local officials in alleviating the immediate social and economic impacts to people, property, and infrastructure, and continuing to assess the magnitude of the event;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Bob Ferguson, Governor of the state of Washington, as a result of the above-noted situation and under Chapters 38.52 and 43.06 RCW, do hereby proclaim that a State of Emergency exists in Chelan, Douglas, Franklin, Garfield, Klickitat, Lincoln, Pacific, Pierce, Spokane, Wahkiakum, and Whitman counties, and direct the plans and procedures in the Washington State Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan to be implemented in these counties. State agencies and departments are directed to utilize state resources in accordance with the Washington State Comprehensive Emergency Management

Plan and to do everything reasonably possible to assist affected political subdivisions in an effort to respond to and recover from the incident.
