Aligned Poverty Efforts

• Integrated Eligibility & Enrollment (IE&E) Project Update

Alex Panagotacos welcomed and introduced the Aligned Poverty Efforts panelists. Juanita Maestas shared an update from the recent Poverty Reduction Steering Committee meeting. Topics at that meeting included: rent control, holding landlords accountable, food insecurity and review of forms with time limits, and WIC and SNAP benefits are essential for people experiencing poverty. Juanita expressed the Steering Committee's continued dedication to advocating for these programs and the importance of including those with current lived experience, as things change.

Drayton Jackson explained the importance of reducing confusion by having two plans, the LEWPRO 5- and Poverty Reduction Work Group (PRWG) 10-year plans and how the 10-year plan was successfully implemented during the pandemic. Drayton affirmed the need to get feedback from the community, non-profit organizations, and the PRWG members, especially when developing legislation.

Donna Christensen shared her experience participating in the PRWG and how it has changed how she and colleagues approach their work.

Lori Pfingst presented an update on the Economic Justice Alliance and shared an update on recent local and federal poverty data.

Alliance Alignment

Lori Pfingst explained how the absence of lived experience in this work transformed poverty in Washington State during the pandemic by including the people with lived experience involved in conversations, is central to understanding how poverty plays out, and what it means to experience economic justice.

Lori shared examples of how the 10-year plan is being used by agencies' and advocates, as well as involving people with lived experience, and the positive impact made to their budget and policy requests.

Lori announced the new name, "Economic Justice Alliance", and future plans to define economic justice and partnership with communities across the state.

Public Comment

Just Futures Presentation

Lori Pfingst and Faduma Fido shared the successes of the partnership of 15 organizations involved with Just Futures and the People's Economy Lab over the past two years. The Just Futures Project focused on creating an equitable, generative, and transformative change and the two objectives are to:

- Elevate leadership and participation of communities most impacted and historically excluded in setting the vision, measures, assessing progress, and holding the state accountable; and
- Create opportunities for government agencies to collaborate with community-owned enterprises to direct targeted investments, where people most impacted are central to decision making.

Opioid Epidemic in Washington State and How It Impacts Poverty

A nine-person panel with representatives from the Department of Health (DOH), Foundation for Homelessness and Poverty Management, PRWG Steering Committee, Catholic Community Services/Catholic Housing Services of Western Washington, Health Care Authority (HCA), and the Department of Social and Health Services shared information on how the Washington State Opioid Epidemic is impacting poverty.
